MARCH IN THE 2013 MACY'S THANKSGIVING PARADE





n November 28, 2013, a musical tradition will continue. In celebration of the 80th anniversary of the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade[™] in 2006, an inaugural "national band" debuted to rave reviews. Once again, Macy's Annual Events has selected MUSIC FESTIVALS as their proud partner in forming the seventh annual Macy's Great American Marching Band.

Honoring America's finest young musicians, this band will be comprised of select students from all over the United States. Under the direction of Auburn University's Dr. Richard Good and Mr. Barry Houser, University of Illinois, the 185 musicians will be complemented by approximately 30 flags and dancers choreographed by DCI and WGI experienced staff.

The Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade[™] is internationally recognized as the official start of the holiday season and world-famous as a uniquely American entertainment extravaganza. Once again, this prestigious band will take an honor position among the gigantic helium balloons, impressive floats carrying celebrities, and the nation's top marching bands. Stepping-off from Central Park, the Band will be cheered by the 2.5 million spectators lining the parade route. Arriving at Macy's Herald Square, the Band will perform for celebrity hosts, a grandstand audience, and more than 50 million TV viewers watching the broadcast live on NBC.

In addition to marching in the parade, all selected participants will enjoy the electric sights and sounds of New York City with included meals, lodging, and sightseeing. Are you ready to be a part of the Macy's Great American Marching Band?



Applicants must be an enrolled freshmen to senior (9th-12th grade) high school student during the 2013-2014 school year. Slots by state and position are limited. **Deadlines** for rolling admission are March 30th, May 30th, June 30th, August 15th, and September 30th. Apply early for the best chance of selection as openings by state and or instrument/position can close at anytime after the first deadline.

All applicants will be notified of acceptance on a rolling basis. A *non-refundable* application processing fee of \$15.00 is required by each participant. Brass and woodwind players must submit an audio recording (cassette or CD). Percussionists, flags and dancers must submit a video audition (DVD our YouTube).



All selected participants are required to be at the hotel in New Jersey (outside of NYC) by 8:00 p.m. on Saturday, November 23, 2013. The first mandatory group activity will take place at Sunday's breakfast and continue through Thursday evening. Friday, November 29th is the return home travel day (breakfast at hotel is included).



The Macy's Great American Marching Band participant package is \$1,519.00 per *musician* or \$1,579.00 per *flag/dancer* and includes:

The \$1,519.00 / 1,579.00 per participant cost <u>does not</u> include transportation costs. *Travel to/from NYC/NJ is the responsibility of the student*. Motorcoach transportation while in NYC/NJ is provided. In addition, members will be met at Penn Station, LaGuardia, JFK, and Newark Airports by an official Band staff member for included transfers to/from the host hotel.

PAYMENT INFORMATION

The \$1,519.00 / \$1,579.00 per participant fee (*quad occupancy*) is divided into installments based on your acceptance date. Final balance will be due by October 21, 2013. You will receive a payment schedule and coupons in your Acceptance Binder. *All payments are non-refundable*.

All selected participants will be housed in quad rooms (four people) with two double beds. Upgrades to doubles are available at an additional charge; however, single occu-


